Polices, Forms and Procedures

- ✓ Progress Reports (We give ours to the principals to send home)
- ✓ Sign-in and sign-out sheets for staff
- ✓ Calendar of events and staff meetings

Summer School Academic Academies Steps to Accreditation



- If you are a Middle School, contact County Superintendent and file papers for credits.
- This will require:
 - Approval by the local Board of Education
 - Employment of highly qualified teachers
 - A minimum of 100 hours of instruction

Benefits of an Accredited Program

- Gain credibility with administration and parents
- Gain support from District
- Fulfills a need in the community
- Possibly gaining tuition students from other districts

Recommended Students



Important!

- o Staff is asked to **recommend** students that did not fail courses , but would benefit from summer instruction.
- o A letter is generated from the 21st CCLC office alerting parents that their child is recommended for summer school .
- o Parents and students sign a contract agreeing to attend the entire program. If students miss more than one required day without a doctor's note they are removed from the program.

Required Students



- o These students are recommended by teachers and principals.
- o These students are in risk of not being promoted and in some cases not moving on to high school.
- o These parents receive a letter from the principal that states, “In coordination with the Freehold Borough 21st CCLC program, your child is required to attend summer school.”

DOOLITTLE DID IT FIRST

On December 18, 1941, the United States was still in a state of shock and confusion over the attack on Pearl Harbor. The Japanese had just launched a surprise attack on the U.S. Navy base in Hawaii, and the news of the attack had just been broadcast on the radio. In the middle of this chaos, a group of 28 B-25 Superfortresses, led by Captain James H. Doolittle, took off from the aircraft carrier USS Yorktown and flew 2,400 miles to attack the Japanese mainland. The mission was a daring and risky one, but it was successful. The bombers caused significant damage to the Japanese air base at Tokyo, and the attack was a major morale boost for the United States. Doolittle's mission is remembered as a turning point in the war, and it is a testament to the courage and ingenuity of the men who flew the bombers.
